You Can Continue a Legacy of Lives Transformed

At Seamen's Society for Children and Families, care is defined by lives transformed. Together with friends and donors like you, we go beyond simply finding ways to help children and families survive — we secure opportunities for them to thrive and build shared experiences that make life vibrant, healthy, and safe.

Founded in 1846 to care for the abandoned children of sailors from the Port of New York, Seamen's Society was one of the first organizations in the country to offer a home-based, safe refuge for children. Since our beginnings, the heart of our mission has been the well-being of our community's most vulnerable children. This commitment expanded over time to encompass the strengthening and preservation of entire families — ensuring children grow in safe environments that provide the greatest opportunity for success and happiness.

Paying attention to the holistic well-being of every child means Seamen's Society is a uniquely impactful resource in our community. We provide comprehensive programs and support to children and caregivers, from the cradle into adulthood.





Our programs include:

- Foster Care & Adoption Services, focusing on kinship placement with family or friends to minimize disruption for the child.
- Domestic/Intimate Partner Violence Support & Intervention, including our Safe Passage program for survivor counseling and services, and support for children exposed to domestic/intimate partner violence.
- Family Support Services, including counseling for challenges like substance abuse, case management, referrals, and advocacy for public benefits.
- Youth Enrichment & Educational Opportunities, like scholarships, mentoring, organized experiences, events, and trips.





Marking 175 Years by Charting the Course for Future Impact

Seamen's Society is privileged to serve, on any given day, over 1,250 children and over 500 families in New York City. The individuals and families we support are our neighbors.

- Laying the groundwork to grow Seamen's Society's impact beyond Staten Island and Brooklyn — bringing the same drive to building vibrant, healthy futures for children and families to other boroughs.

As a centerpiece of the campaign, we are also thrilled to announce the establishment of the **Robert and Barbara Fitzsimmons Children and Family Fund at Seamen's Society.**

Robert and Barbara Fitzsimmons were both incredibly involved with Seamen's Society — with Barbara serving on the **Board of Directors and Advisory Board** through the 1980s and 90s. The fund is established in their memory by their children, Laura Volsario, current Board Chair, and Robert Fitzsimmons, Jr. It will fund experiential opportunities for children and families, including cultural, educational, and recreational activities. As Laura shared, her parents "had a passion for helping people and supporting the community" — and we are honored to continue their legacy long into the future.



At Seamen's Society, we are committed to measuring our IMPACT.

In 2020 alone:

1,100 children and 560 families empowered through our Family Support Services Program.

483 children cared for through our Foster Care Program.

1,320 food cards distributed to families in care.

\$30,000 in scholarships awarded to help young adults pursue a college or vocational degree.

2,641 sessions held with domestic/intimate partner violence clients.

1,502 clients supported through our Domestic/Intimate Partner Violence Program.
